ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF ETHIOPIAN GIRLS' BRIGHT FUTURE FUND

Article I - Name

The name of this corporation is Ethiopian Girls' Bright Future Fund (the "Corporation").

Article II - Registered Office & Agent

The principal office of the Corporation is located at:

10670 Hawthorn Trail, Saint Paul, MN 55129-8768

The Corporation's registered agent shall be designated in accordance with the laws of the State of Minnesota.

Article III – Incorporation Under Minnesota Law

The Corporation is incorporated under the Minnesota Nonprofit Corporation Act, Minnesota Statutes Chapter 317A.

Article IV - Purpose

The Corporation is organized and operated exclusively for charitable and educational purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

The specific purpose of the Corporation is to empower young women from low-income families in remote Ethiopian communities by providing educational support, including school materials, hygiene products, and transportation, thereby helping them break the cycle of poverty and pursue their academic and professional aspirations.

Article V - Nonprofit Status

The Corporation shall be nonprofit, nonstock, and nonpartisan. It shall not be operated for the benefit of private interests, and no part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, its members, trustees, directors, officers, or other private persons, except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered in furtherance of its mission.

Article VI – Limitations on Activities

1. No Political or Legislative Activities

- No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall involve carrying on propaganda or attempting to influence legislation.
- The Corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in, any political campaign on behalf of, or in opposition to, any candidate for public office.

2. No Private Benefit

 The Corporation is organized exclusively for charitable and educational purposes. It shall not engage in any activities that do not further its tax-exempt purpose.

Article VII - Dissolution

Upon dissolution of the Corporation, all remaining assets shall be distributed exclusively for tax-exempt purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The assets shall be distributed to one or more organizations that are organized and operated exclusively for charitable or educational purposes and qualify as tax-exempt under Section 501(c)(3).
